



## 2023-2024 Student Health Insurance Plan for the Domestic Students of University of Wyoming

### Who is eligible to enroll?

All registered non-international undergraduate students enrolled in 12 or more credit hours, students in the WWAMI program, Undergraduate student teachers during their teaching term and graduate students including students at the University of Wyoming/Casper College, Teton Science School and those in the Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) program enrolled in nine or more credit hours are eligible to enroll in this Insurance Plan at the time of registration. Undergraduates taking six to 11.5 credit hours and graduate students taking 4.5 to 8.5 credit hours are eligible to enroll in this Insurance Plan and the part-time benefit fee package at the time of registration. Graduate students who are otherwise eligible for the part-time benefit package are eligible to enroll in this Insurance Plan. Undergraduate students taking summer classes must be enrolled in three credit hours over this period to be eligible to enroll in this Insurance Plan. Graduate students taking summer classes must be enrolled in one credit hours over this period to be eligible to enroll in this Insurance Plan. Students in the Bachelors Reach for Accelerated Nursing Degree (BRAND) and those who are in their final Pharmacy semester rotations, who meet the credit hours requirements are also eligible, as are students required to serve all or parts of their academic programs at remote locations (Sheridan, WY, for example) and who are therefore unable to access the on-campus student health services clinic first before seeking medical services in their field study/academic location proximity.

The student (Named Insured, as defined in the Certificate) must actively attend classes for at least the first 31 days after the date for which coverage is purchased. Home study, correspondence, and online courses do not fulfill the eligibility requirements that the student actively attend classes. The Company maintains its right to investigate eligibility or student status and attendance records to verify that the Policy eligibility requirements have been met. If and whenever the Company discovers that the Policy eligibility requirements have not been met, its only obligation is refund of premium.

Please read the certificate of coverage to determine whether this plan is right before you enroll. The certificate of coverage provides details of the coverage including benefits, exclusions, and reductions or limitations and the terms under which the coverage may be continued in force. The Insured Person must meet the eligibility requirements each time a premium payment is made. To avoid a lapse in coverage, the Insured Person's premium must be received within 14 days after the coverage expiration date. It is the Insured Person's responsibility to make timely premium payments to avoid a lapse in coverage.

## Student Health Service (SHS) Referral Required

### OUTPATIENT SERVICES ONLY

The student must use the services of the Health Center first where outpatient treatment will be administered or referral issued. Expenses incurred for medical treatment rendered outside of the Student Health Service for which no prior approval or referral is obtained are excluded from coverage. A referral issued by the SHS must accompany the claim when submitted. Only one referral is required for each Injury or Sickness per Policy Year.

A SHS referral for outside care is not necessary only under any of the following conditions:

1. Medical Emergency. The student must return to SHS for necessary follow-up care.
2. When the Student Health Service is closed.
3. When service is rendered at another facility during break or vacation periods.
4. Medical care received when the student is more than 40 miles from campus.
5. Medical care obtained when a student is no longer able to use the SHS due to a change in student status.
6. Maternity, obstetrical and gynecological care.
7. Mental Illness treatment and Substance Use Disorder treatment.

## Exclusions and Limitations

No benefits will be paid for: a) loss or expense caused by, contributed to, or resulting from; or b) treatment, services or supplies for, at, or related to any of the following:

1. Acne.
2. Acupuncture.
3. Addiction, such as:
  - Caffeine addiction.
  - Non-chemical addiction, such as: gambling, sexual, spending, shopping, working and religious.
  - Codependency.
4. Behavioral problems. Learning disabilities.
5. Biofeedback.
6. Circumcision.
7. Cosmetic procedures, except reconstructive procedures:
  - To correct an Injury or treat a Sickness for which benefits are otherwise payable under the Policy. The primary result of the procedure is not a changed or improved physical appearance.
  - Required as a result of a birth defect.

8. Dental treatment, except:
  - For accidental Injury to Sound, Natural Teeth.
  - As described under Dental Treatment in the Policy.This exclusion does not apply to benefits specifically provided in Pediatric Dental Services.
9. Elective Surgery or Elective Treatment.
10. Elective abortion.
11. Flight in any kind of aircraft, except while riding as a passenger on a regularly scheduled flight of a commercial airline, or chartered aircraft only while participating in a school sponsored activity.
12. Foot care for the following:
  - Flat foot conditions.
  - Supportive devices for the foot.
  - Subluxations of the foot.
  - Fallen arches.
  - Weak feet.
  - Chronic foot strain.
  - Routine foot care including the care, cutting and removal of corns, calluses, toenails, and bunions (except capsular or bone surgery).This exclusion does not apply to preventive foot care due to conditions associated with metabolic, neurologic, or peripheral vascular disease.
13. Genetic testing, except as specifically provided in the Policy.
14. Hearing examinations. Hearing aids. Other treatment for hearing defects and hearing loss. "Hearing defects" means any physical defect of the ear which does or can impair normal hearing, apart from the disease process.  
This exclusion does not apply to:
  - Hearing defects or hearing loss as a result of an infection or Injury.
15. Hirsutism. Alopecia.
16. Immunizations, except as specifically provided in the Policy. Preventive medicines or vaccines, except where required for treatment of a covered Injury or as specifically provided in the Policy.
17. Injury or Sickness for which benefits are paid or payable under any Workers' Compensation or Occupational Disease Law or Act, or similar legislation.
18. Injury sustained while:
  - Participating in any intercollegiate or professional sport, contest or competition.
  - Traveling to or from such sport, contest or competition as a participant.
  - Participating in any practice or conditioning program for such sport, contest or competition.
19. Participation in a riot or civil disorder. Commission of or attempt to commit a felony. Fighting.
20. Prescription Drugs, services or supplies as follows:
  - Therapeutic devices or appliances, including: support garments and other non-medical substances, regardless of intended use, except as specifically provided in the Policy.
  - Immunization agents, except as specifically provided in the Policy.
  - Drugs labeled, "Caution - limited by federal law to investigational use" or experimental drugs.
  - Products used for cosmetic purposes.
  - Drugs used to treat or cure baldness. Anabolic steroids used for body building.
  - Anorectics - drugs used for the purpose of weight control.
  - Fertility agents or sexual enhancement drugs.
  - Refills in excess of the number specified or dispensed after one (1) year of date of the prescription.
21. Reproductive services for the following:
  - Procreative counseling.
  - Genetic counseling and genetic testing, except as specifically provided in the Policy.
  - Cryopreservation of reproductive materials. Storage of reproductive materials.
  - Fertility tests.
  - Infertility treatment (male or female), including any services or supplies rendered for the purpose or with the intent of inducing conception, except for the treatment of the underlying cause.
  - Premarital examinations.
  - Impotence, organic or otherwise.
  - Reversal of sterilization procedures.
22. Routine eye examinations. Eye refractions. Eyeglasses. Contact lenses. Prescriptions or fitting of eyeglasses or contact lenses. Vision correction surgery. Treatment for visual defects and problems.  
This exclusion does not apply as follows:
  - When due to a covered Injury or disease process.
  - To benefits specifically provided in Pediatric Vision Services.
  - To one pair of prescription eyeglasses or contact lenses when necessary to replace the human lens lost through intraocular surgery or ocular Injury.

23. Routine Newborn Infant Care and well-baby nursery and related Physician charge, except as specifically provided in the Policy.
24. Preventive care services which are not specifically provided in the Policy, including:
  - Routine physical examinations and routine testing.
  - Preventive testing or treatment.
  - Screening exams or testing in the absence of Injury or Sickness.
25. Services provided normally without charge by the Health Service of the Policyholder. Services covered or provided by the student health fee.
26. Skeletal irregularities of one or both jaws, including orthognathia and mandibular retrognathia, except for orthognathic surgery to treat a Congenital Condition or restoration as a result of a covered Injury. Temporomandibular joint dysfunction. Deviated nasal septum, including submucous resection and/or other surgical correction thereof. Nasal and sinus surgery, except for treatment of a covered Injury or treatment of chronic sinusitis
27. Skydiving. Parachuting. Hang gliding. Glider flying. Parasailing. Sail planing. Bungee jumping.
28. Speech therapy, except as specifically provided in the Policy.
29. Stand-alone multi-disciplinary smoking cessation programs. These are programs that usually include health care providers specializing in smoking cessation and may include a psychologist, social worker or other licensed or certified professional.
30. Supplies, except as specifically provided in the Policy.
31. Surgical breast reduction, breast augmentation, breast implants or breast prosthetic devices, or gynecomastia, except as specifically provided in the Policy.
32. Treatment in a Government hospital, unless there is a legal obligation for the Insured Person to pay for such treatment.
33. War or any act of war, declared or undeclared; or while in the armed forces of any country (a pro-rata premium will be refunded upon request for such period not covered).
34. Weight management. Weight reduction. Nutrition programs. Treatment for obesity (except morbid obesity). Surgery for removal of excess skin or fat. This exclusion does not apply to benefits specifically provided in the Policy.

## UnitedHealthcare Global: Global Emergency Services

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If you are a student insured with this insurance plan, you are eligible for UnitedHealthcare Global Emergency Services. The requirements to receive these services are as follows:

Domestic Students: you are eligible for UnitedHealthcare Global services when 100 miles or more away from your campus address or 100 miles or more away from your permanent home address or while participating in a Study Abroad program.

The Assistance and Evacuation Benefits and related services are not meant to be used in lieu of or replace local emergency services such as an ambulance requested through emergency 911 telephone assistance. **All services must be arranged and provided by UnitedHealthcare Global; any services not arranged by UnitedHealthcare Global will not be considered for payment.** If the condition is an emergency, you should go immediately to the nearest physician or hospital without delay and then contact the 24-hour Emergency Response Center. UnitedHealthcare Global will then take the appropriate action to assist you and monitor your care until the situation is resolved.

- Description of the patient's condition;
- Name, location, and telephone number of hospital, if applicable;
- Name and telephone number of the attending physician; and
- Information of where the physician can be immediately reached.

HealthiestYou is not health insurance. HealthiestYou is designed to complement, and not replace, the care you receive from your primary care physician. HealthiestYou physicians are an independent network of doctors who advise, diagnose, and prescribe at their own discretion. HealthiestYou physicians provide cross coverage and operate subject to state regulations. Physicians in the independent network do not prescribe DEA controlled substances, non-therapeutic drugs and certain other drugs which may be harmful because of their potential for abuse. HealthiestYou does not guarantee that a prescription will be written. Services may vary by state.

\*Available to Insured students; age restrictions may apply. If you call prior to the effective date of your coverage under the insurance plan, you will be charged a service fee before being connected to a board-certified physician.

### 24/7 StudentAssist

Insureds have immediate access to the StudentAssist, a service that coordinates care using a network of resources. Services available include:

- 24/7 Crisis Support - access to trained master's level specialists, 24/7/365, who provide in-the-moment support and consultation.
- Financial and Legal Counseling – two 30 minute telephonic consultations with money coaches who offer consultations on issues such as financial planning, credit and collection issues, home buying and renting and more. Legal Services are provided by licensed state-specific attorneys. One 30 minute telephonic or face-to-face legal consultation per issue per year at no cost.
