Snow Iris (or Dwarf Iris) - Iris reticulata 'Pixie'

Daffodils – 'Marieke', 'Tete-a-tete', 'Jetfire', 'Fragrant Rose' 🖬

Tulipa humilis types (note: all sorts of creatures like to eat tulips) Tulipa batalinii - 'Yellow Jewel', 'Bronze Charm' Tulipa greigii

Early Flowers and Fabulous Foliage:

Pasque flower (*Pulsatilla patens*) – native *Phlox kelseyi* 'Lemhi Purple' (Kelsey's phlox) – native *bifida* (cleft phlox) – native *hoodii* (Spiny phlox) – native Woolly Speedwell (*Veronica pectinata*)

Golden Currant – native

Curlicue Artemisia (Artemisia versicolor 'Seafoam') 🗂

Sugarbowl clematis (Clematis scottii) – native 🗂

Early Summer:

Iris (Iris spp.) - Iris pallida 'Variegata' 🖬 Iris – miniature, dwarf, tall 着 Sand Cherry (Prunus besseyi) - native White Tufted Evening Primrose (Oenothera caespitosa) – native 🖷 ? Lamb's Ear (Stachys byzantina) 'Helen Von Stein' 'Silver Carpet' 着 Thyme 着 Iceplant (Delosperma congestum) 'Gold Nugget' 着 Pussytoes (Antennaria spp.) 'McClintock', Rosy – native, don't know deer resistant status, would expect minimal damage due it being so short Hens & Chicks (Sempervivum) 着 Pinks (Dianthus spp.) D. gratianopolitanus 'Firewitch' 'Tiny Rubies' 着 Sulfur Flower (Eriogonum umbellatum) – native 着 Catmint (Nepeta spp.) – sterile, veg propagated varieties such as 'Walker's Low', 'Six Hills Giant' 着

Penstemon – native (many penstemon are reported to be \vec{m} , however reports are variable so you'll have to experiment)

Water-Wise Tips:

- Plan the garden
- Use turf thoughtfully
- Select and group plants according to their water needs
- Mulch
- Water efficiently
- Maintain the landscape
- Consider wildfire

Others not shown to try: eriantherus (fuzzytongue penstemon) – will prob need to grow from seed hallii (Hall's beardtongue) – will prob need to grow from seed barbatus (Beardlip penstemon) palmeri (Palmer's beardtongue) virens (Bluemist penstemon)

Missouri Evening Primrose (*Oenothera macrocarpa* or *missouriensis*) – native and Meadow Sage (*Salvia nemorosa*) 'May Night'

Mid Summer:

Blanket Flower (*Gaillardia* spp.) – native Yarrow (*Achillea* spp.) 'Moonshine' Partridge Feather (*Tanacetum densum* ssp. *amani*) Prairie Coneflower (*Ratibida columnifera*) – native Poppy Mallow (*Callirhoe involucrata*) – native Blue Avena grass (*Helictotrichon sempervirens*)

Late Summer:

Sedum 'Autumn Joy', Lanceleaf Sedum (Sedum lanceolatum) Coneflowers (Rudbeckia hirta and Echinacea angustifolia) – native

Wild Four O'Clock (*Mirabilis multiflora*) – native, variable reports of deer resistance

Hummingbird Trumpet (Zauschneria garrettii) – native 🛒

Goldenrod (Solidago) 'Golden Baby' – native 🗖

Gayfeather (*Liatris punctata*) – native

Colchicums ('Lilac Wonder', 'Rosy Dawn') 🗂

Native = native to great plains or rocky mountain region

- = reported to be not as preferred by deer (no guarantees though not deer proof!). Be sure to protect all plants recently bought from the nursery until they become acclimated and deer don't notice them so much as new.
- d Deer like to taste plants even when they don't prefer them.

- ➡ Deer preferences sometime vary by location, which is all very annoying and may be why we see variability among recommendations.
- d Just because deer don't eat it doesn't mean rabbits, ground squirrels, etc, etc. won't.
- f In bad years dry, lack of food, etc. all bets are off!
